## Google Chrome Browser Sign In

Did you know? When you sign in to the Google Chrome browser, all your Chrome data, such as bookmarks, history, and settings, is synced to your Google account and available on any device. Any changes you make to your data on one device sync to all other devices. If your device is stolen or broken, you can get back your bookmarks, history, and other settings just by signing in to Chrome again on a different device. More... 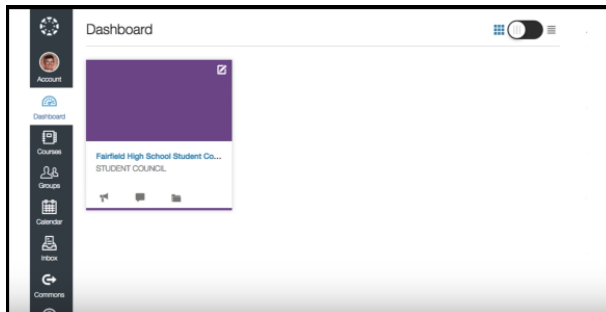


## Read & Write for Google Chrome

Did you know? Fairfield School District pays for the extension Read&Write for Google Chrome and is available to all teachers and students who have a google account. It is an extension that when logged into the Google Chrome browser, allows access to learning support tools. It especially supports students with learning difficulties, dyslexia or ELL/ESL.
